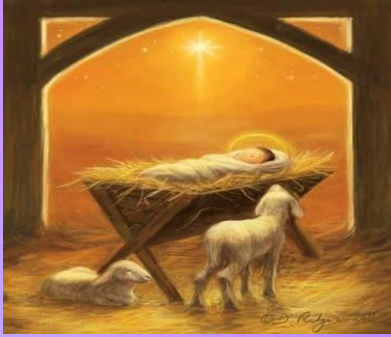

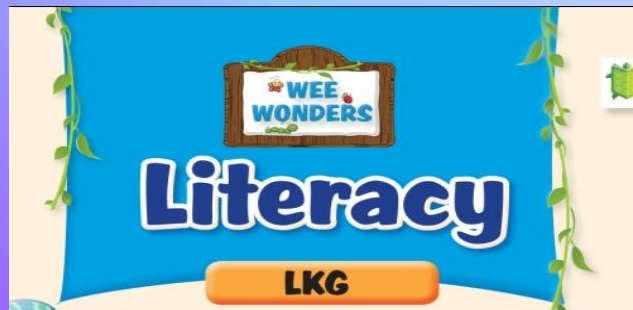


Gross + Fine Motor Skills

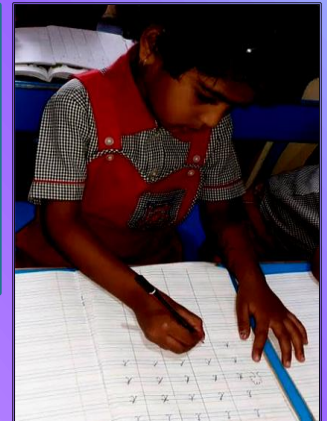




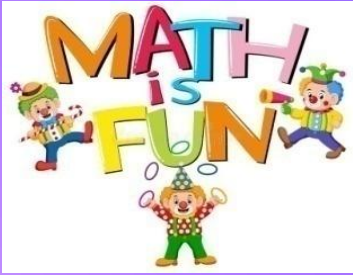
Tracing with

necessary for writing.



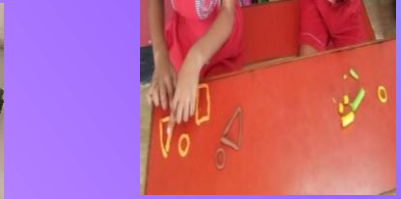
Tracing with slate

Picking up, moving and twisting the pieces of a **puzzle**, helps children to develop finger strength and hand-eye coordination.

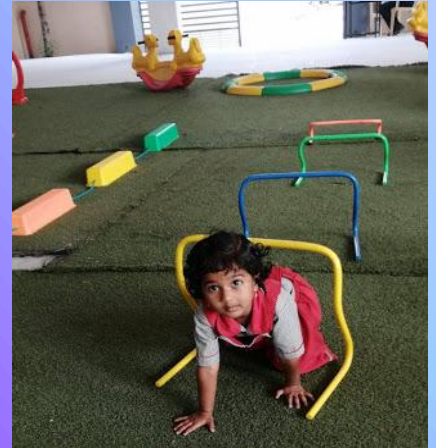


Learning **shapes** helps children identify and organize visual information.

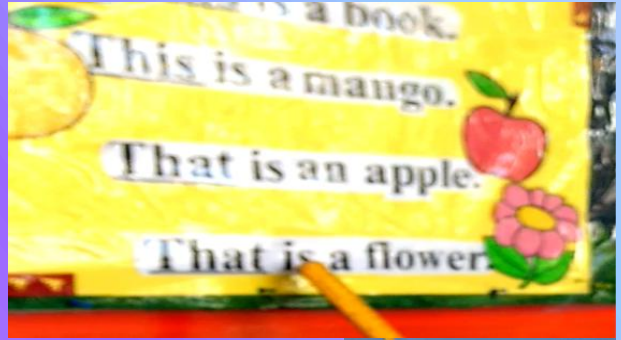


Balance is essential for children to learn how to walk and develop other physical skills.


