Tracing helps child practice the skills necessary for writing.






Tracing with slate pencil.

Learning **Shapes** helps children identify and organize visual information.




Hands on activities to learn numbers.

Reading helps children to develop language and listening skills and prepares them to understand the written word. ...








Lets read words ending with 'ock' and 'uck'.
