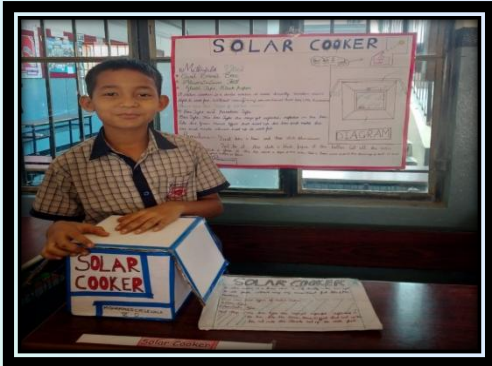
Sixth Graders who did us proud in 2019-20

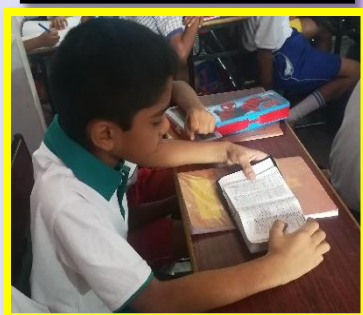
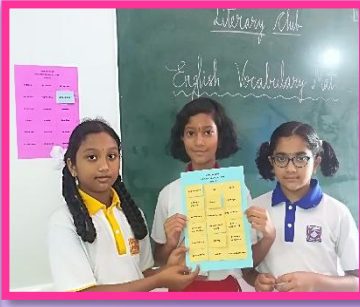


PRIMARY LITERARY CLUB

Children took part in all these competitions with a lot of zest and enthusiasm. They won some and lost some, but the undying spirit of never giving up was commendable and well appreciated.



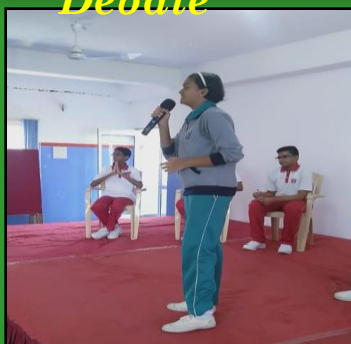
